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## 1. About BKF

### Profile

The Bhutan Kidney Foundation was established in 2012 under the patronage of **Her Majesty the Gyaltsuen, Jetsun Pema Wangchuck** with the principle purpose to function as a support group for the well-being of Renal (kidney-related) patients in Bhutan and enhance awareness of the general public on renal diseases in the country.

BKF is a registered Civil Society Organization as **Public Benefit Organization** as per the requirements of the Civil Society Organization Act of the Kingdom of Bhutan and a Board of Trustees governs it. The Foundation was registered on **15<sup>th</sup> August, 2012** corresponding to the **28<sup>th</sup> day of the 6<sup>th</sup> Bhutanese month of the Water Male Dragon Year** with its registration number: **CSOA/PBO-23**.

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After successful kidney transplant on 12<sup>th</sup> April 2006 and inspired by his past experience, **Mr. Tashi Namgay**, the brainchild of the Bhutan Kidney Foundation resigned from government job and fully committed his time devoting his service to the kidney patients guiding them in basic essential care which led to the formation of an informal group called Kidney Transplant and Dialysis Support Group (KTDSG) in 2007. The group comprised of 23 kidney transplant recipients. His conviction is precise, "Save lives for the wellbeing of all sentient beings." He strongly believes that everyone deserves a second life to live and embrace the "Gift of Life."

Activities such as counseling on dialysis, pre-transplant and talk on healthy lifestyle change to prevent non-communicable diseases were arranged on voluntary basis.

As many transplant patients were either government or corporate employees, managing time for those activities lacked attention. Therefore KTDSG couldn't accelerate further. In 2009, Tashi once again gathered all his perseverance; he decided to reenergize the social group solely to benefit underprivileged kidney failures.

In 2011, with immense support and guidance from His Majesty's Secretariat, a set of project documents was submitted to the Civil Society Organization Authority (CSOA) and on 15 August, 2012, the social group was successfully registered as Civil Society Organization under the name of Bhutan Kidney Foundation.

## **Our Thrust/Core Areas**

As a support group to the lives impeded by kidney disease, the Foundation focuses on the following core areas:

### ***I. Awareness & Advocacy (Kidney Health & its issues in Bhutan) focusing on prevention and early detection.***

- i. BKF in collaboration with relevant stakeholders;
- ii. Through BKF's network groups;
- iii. Through social medias and programme on National & local medias.

### ***II. Counseling & Guidance***

- i. On Acute Renal Failure cases and dialysis treatment;
- ii. On kidney transplant and legal procedures;
- iii. On dietary, healthy lifestyle and post transplant care.
- iv. Assist in providing access to health care services.

#### ***i. Patient Care & Support Programme***

- i. Supply of grocery, toiletries and basic necessities at Patient Guest House in Thimphu & Mongar;
- ii. Travel Expenses during referral for treatment within the country as well as abroad;
- iii. Academic Expenses (Scholarship) for patients' school going children;
- iv. Seed money for Home-Based Business (Livelihood Programme)

Note: The entire support programmes are made on verifying the need and genuineness based on the proposal received.

## **Board of Trustees**

The Board of Trustees, chaired by the Chairperson, comprises of individuals from diverse professions and backgrounds.

The Board meets once quarterly to review and direct the programs of the Foundation. The members of the Board of Trustees serve for a term of three years, which may be renewed.

## 1. Awareness & Advocacy (Preventive Measures)

**HEALTHY LIFESTYLE FOR HEALTHY KIDNEYS**



Themed “Kidney Disease & Obesity – Healthy Lifestyle for Healthy Kidneys”, the Bhutan Kidney Foundation (BKF) and Ministry of Health (MoH) jointly organized the event at Faculty of Nursing & Public Health in Thimphu to draw attention on the issues of paramount importance to the NCDs world and keep the issues firmly in the public and political spotlight.

His Excellency, Health Minister, Lyonpo Tandin Wangchuk graced the event as a guest of honor.

- ✓ A total of 215 people attended the programme which comprised representatives from policy makers, government and health officials, Civil Society Organizations, multi and bi-lateral, and faculty members and trainees of FoNPH.
- ✓ As a contribution to mark the event, the BKF coordinated patient consultation service facilitated by Professor Dr. V. Tamilarasi, Head of Nephrology Department, and CMCH – Vellore, India together with Dr. Minjur, Nephrologist, and JDWNR Hospital. A total of 41 cases comprising dialysis patients and kidney transplant recipient were consulted.
- ✓ The Bhutan Broadcasting Service (BBS) hosted a live panel discussion with the member from BKF and its board and MoH to augment the awareness rose during the event.

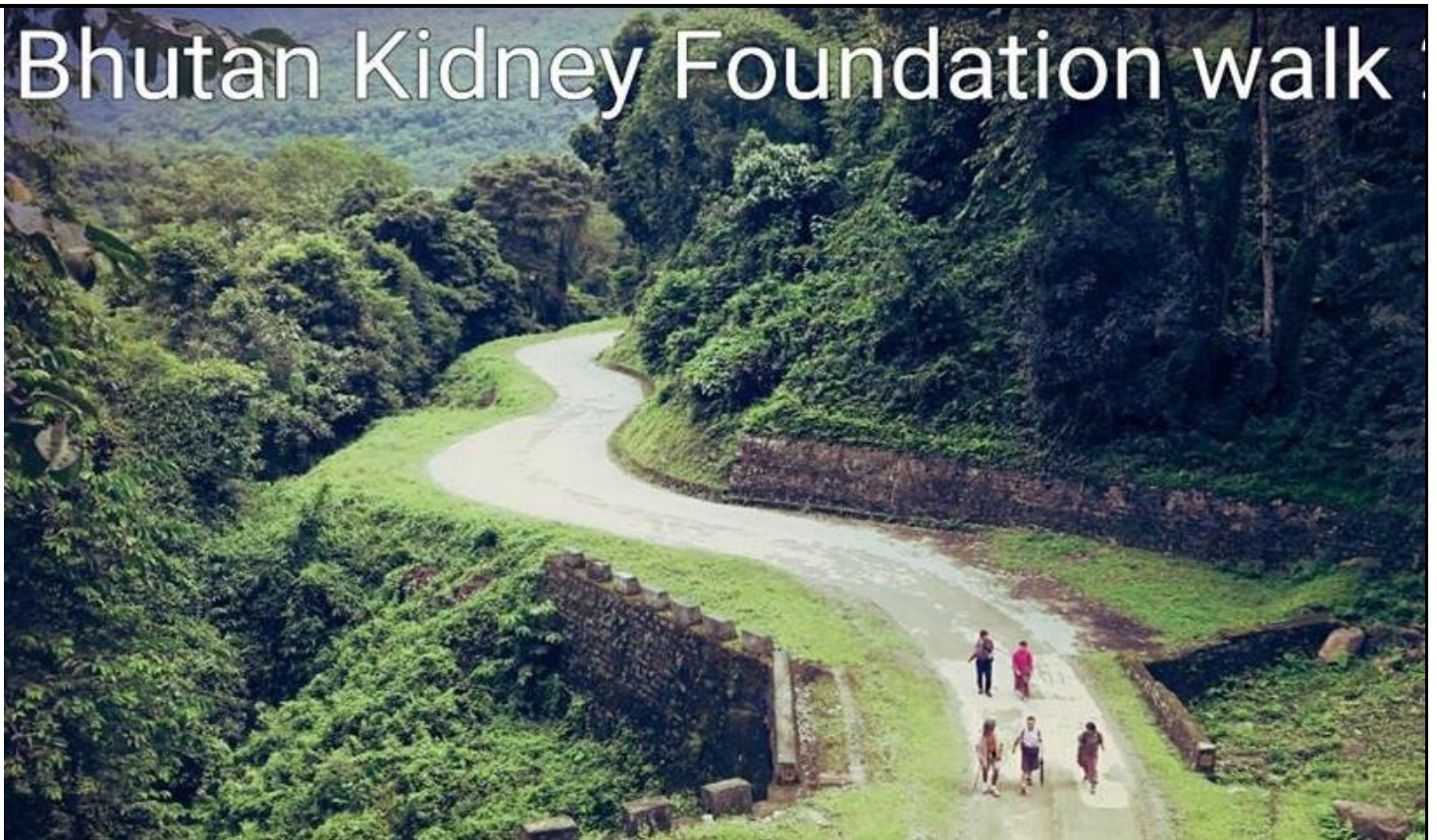

## Awareness & Fund Raising Walk (The Epic Journey):

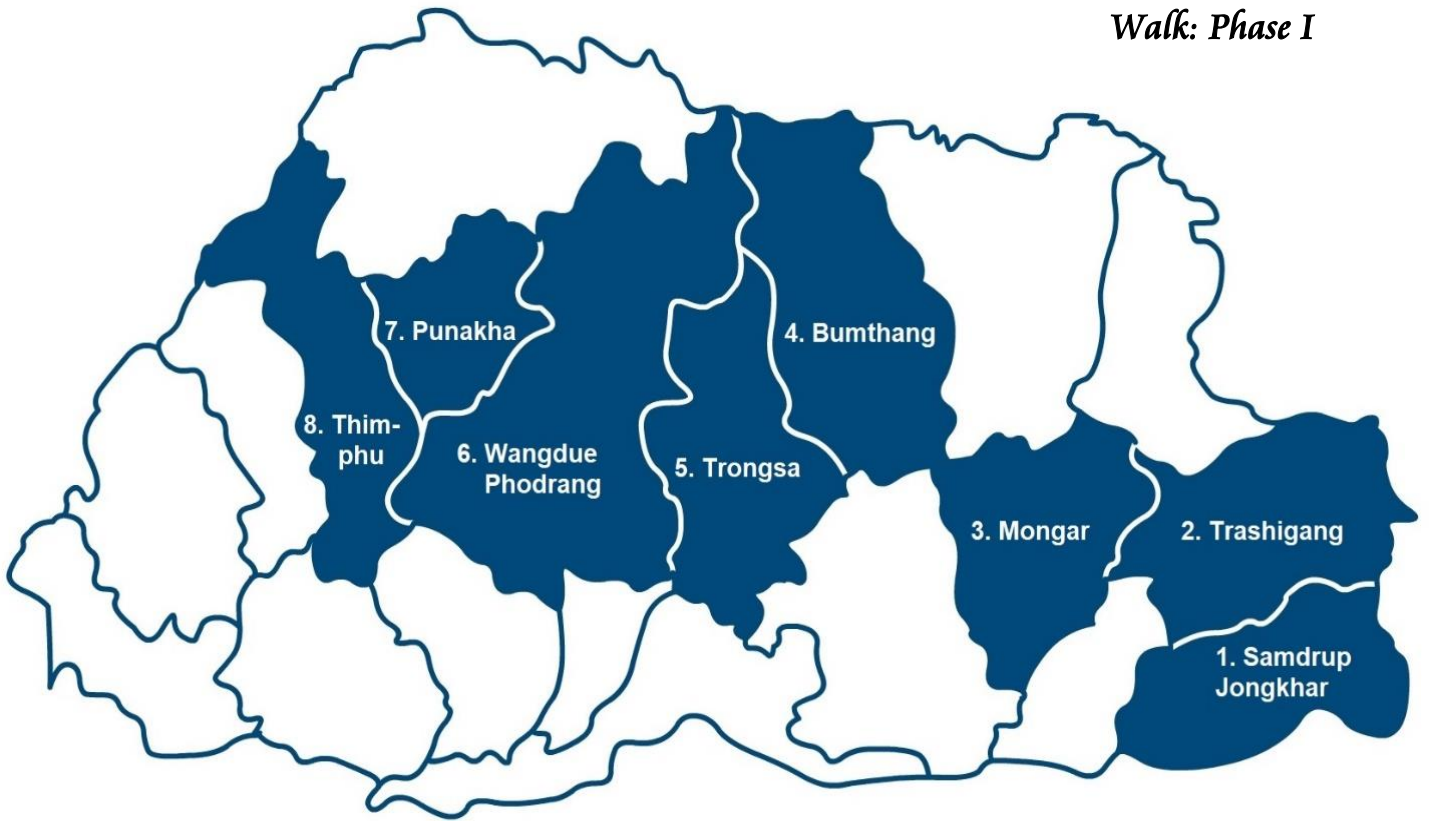
The BKF's reaped a fruitful year 2017 both in terms of generating awareness and fund for the Foundation.

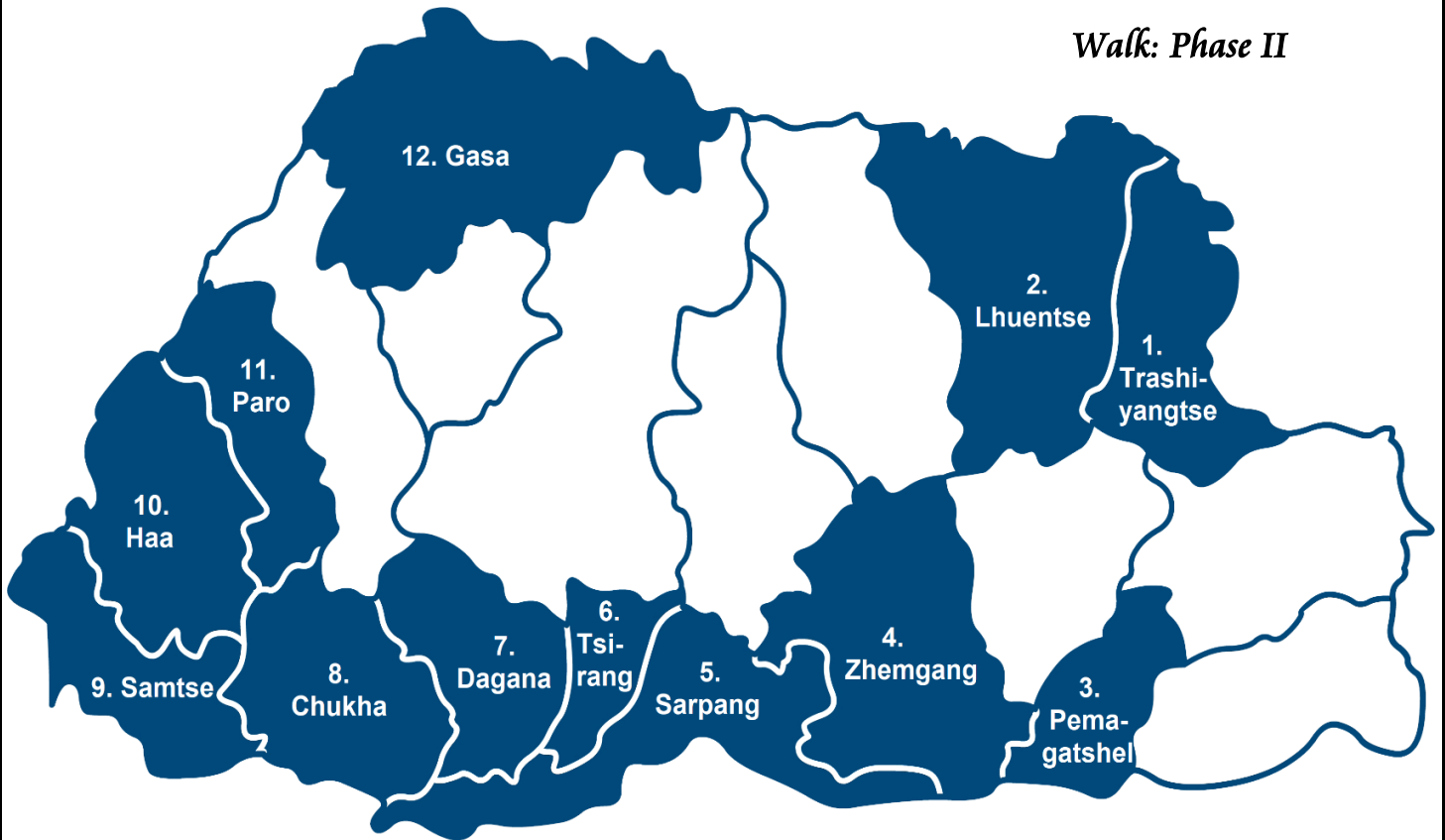

## 2. Patient Care & Support


### Counseling & Guidance

As the only Civil Society Organization in the country advocating on services and care for people with chronic kidney disease, the Bhutan Kidney Foundation (BKF) has relentlessly focused on advocacy, awareness and early detection programs for kidney patients and their families since its inception. Counseling has become the Foundation's most engaged activity on daily basis.

The BKF's involvement in facilitating access to treatment services, guiding and counseling patients and their families has been vital as 90% of the patients come from rural parts of the country with little or no knowledge on services available.

In parallel, the Foundation partners with the Ministry of Health and JDWNR Hospital to improve these access and strengthen the quality of care.

These counseling services and guidance played significant role in successful kidney transplant as we witness many families and relatives coming forward to save their loved ones living with kidney problem.

**The Year 2017 recorded a total of 83 patients and their families who visited the Bhutan Kidney Foundation office to avail the services.**



### **Support at Patient Guest Houses**

Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD) patients under dialysis comprise 90% of the total occupancy at the Patient Guest House in Thimphu, Mongar and Gelephu. In absence of one's relative where dialysis services are catered, undergoing long term treatment and meeting the ends need becomes very challenging and stressful for both the patients and their attendants.

The BKF actively intervenes in this area collaborating with its partners and networks established for timely supply and support of daily necessities and every basic amenities required.

The renovated Kidu Patient Guest House, Thimphu inaugurated on 13/10/2017 coinciding the Royal Wedding.

### *Temporary Patient Guest House in Gelephu*

After series of meeting with the dialysis staffs and personal interaction with the kidney patients of Gelephu Central Regional Referral Hospital; the "**ACCOMMODATION**" problem was highlighted as a major and serious issue faced by many dialysis patients and their attendants.

The Bhutan Kidney Foundation together with its network "BKF-Zhenphen Jangsem Dhetshen further assessed this issue discovering disheartening stories and consequences such as patients compromising the frequency of their dialysis.

In absence of patient guest house and reliable relatives at the center, some patients travel as far as from Zhemgang and Tsirang for their routine dialysis. This further deteriorated patients' health, had huge implication on their marginalized income and as a result many opted to forgo the treatment.

As an alternative measure and immediate solution, the BKF rented one unit flat at Gelephu town since 1<sup>st</sup> August 2017 accommodating 5 dialysis patients.

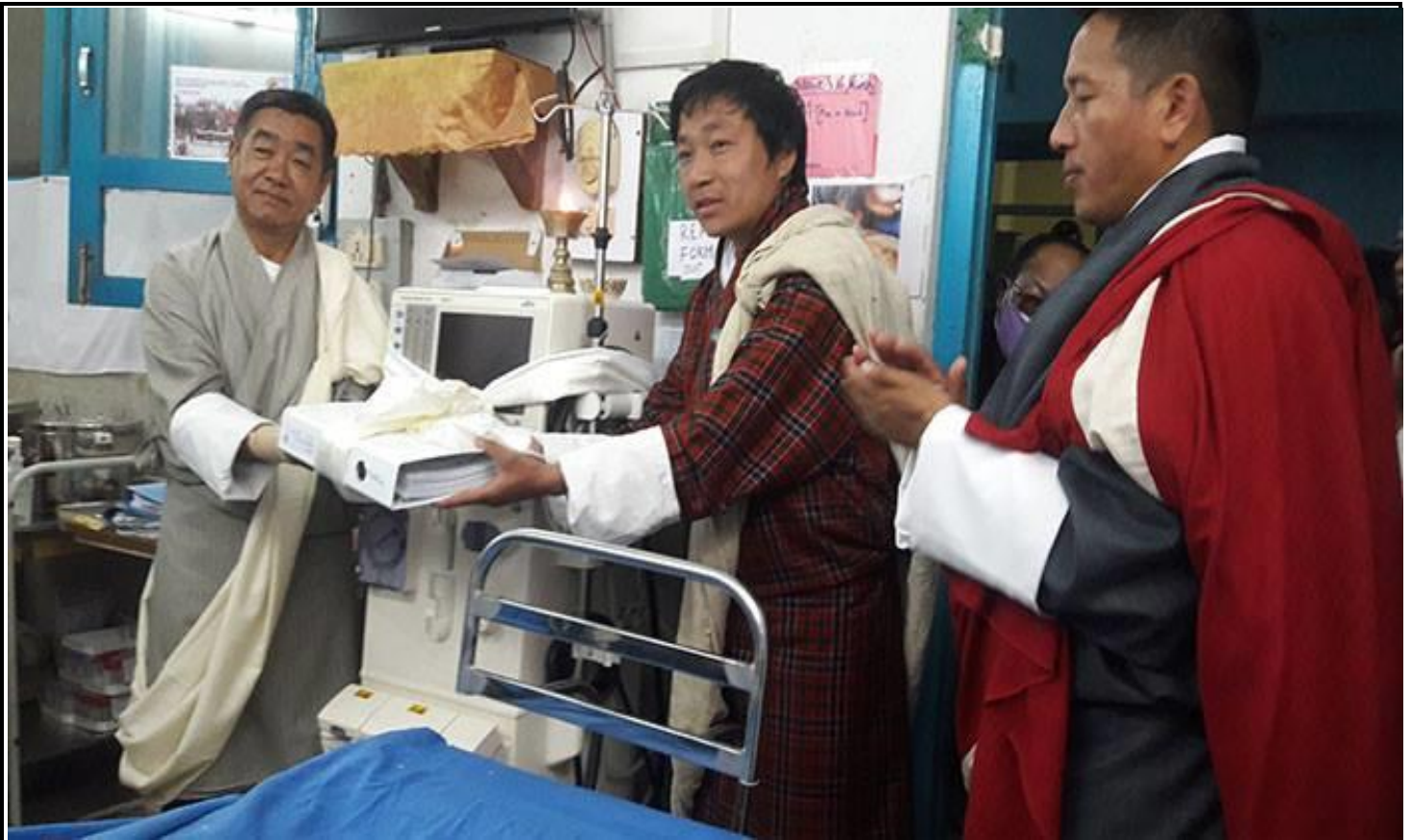

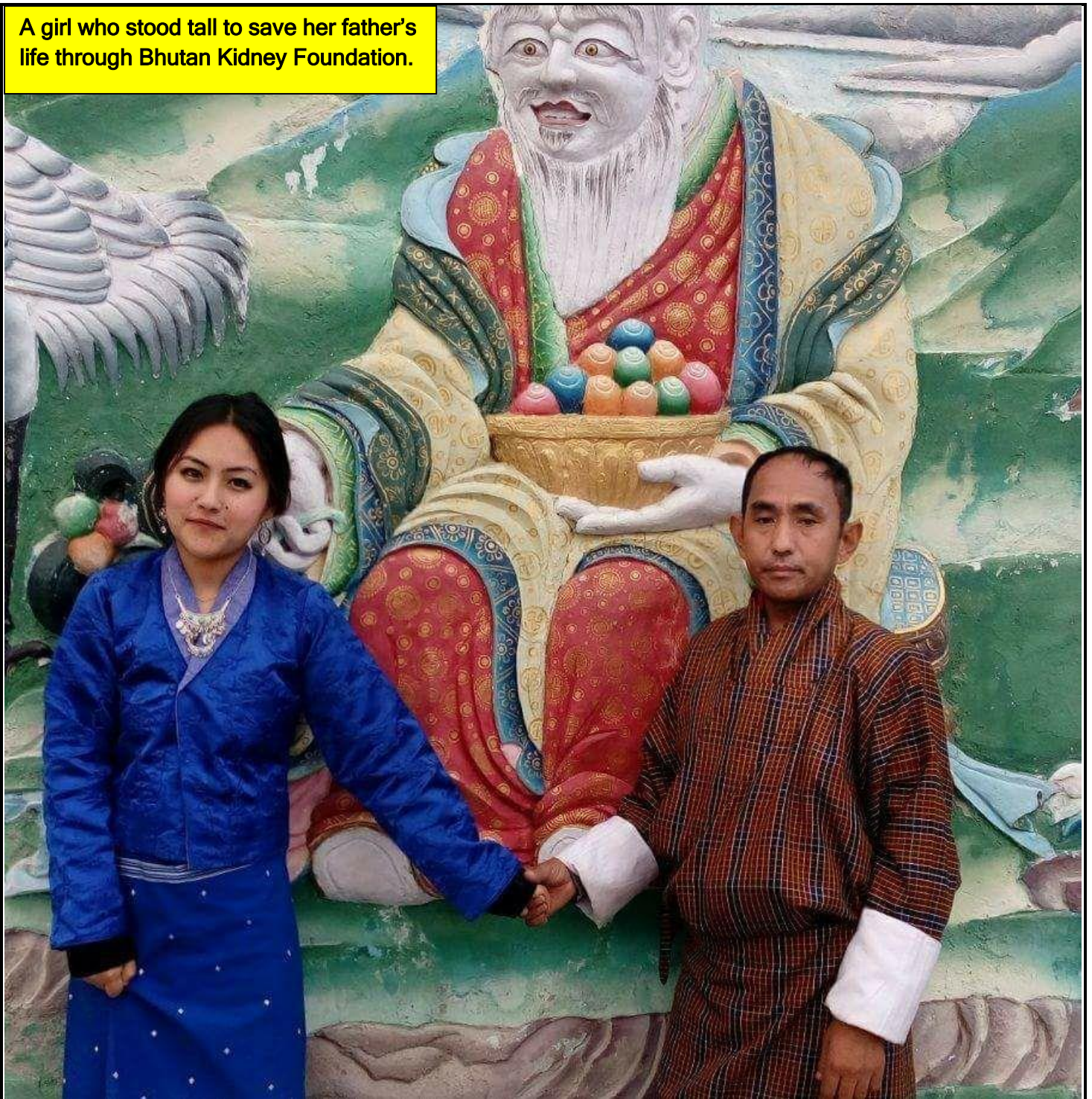

47 year old, Phurpa Dorji Tamang suffered from kidney damage in 2013. The BKF's intervention with constant counselling and support inspired him and his daughter Yeshe Choden Tamang to process for kidney transplant. However, the patient had to wait for 2 years as Yeshe was studying in 11<sup>th</sup> grade then.

With the hope and believe that his daughter is determined to save his life, the father breathe on dialysis for the next 2 years. The BKF published an article about the daughter's will to save her father on social media, and the story depicting bond between father and daughter generated overwhelming support from the public. Today, they are enjoying a normal and healthy lives since the transplant in 2015.
