The only difficulties the office faced was to contact the parents. Some of the residents does not even know their parent's whereabouts which made the office and RBP difficult to trace them and letting them know about their own child.

5. Way forward

The parenting program proved to be a very effective and successful program. The objectives of the program is reaching our long term goal in transforming children's and parent's attitude and beliefs. The office feels such programs does makes lots of difference to both children and the parents and hopes to conduct such program not only in YDRC but in other centers and schools too. The 2 resources persons were highly trained with their inter-personal skills to deal and impart their skills to participants. The Royal Bhutan Police plays important role in building children wholesome education and skills while at YDRC, the program was successful and conducive with the support form Police and YDRC management team.
